SUMMARY:

1. The purpose of the meeting was to commence with six Pre-1028 workshops that will be coordinated over the next six weeks. It was noted that there will be two sessions for each workshop.
2. Jim Schellinger completed the introduction utilizing the PowerPoint presentation, see attached. An outline of the six Pre-1028 workshops was reviewed in detail.
3. Dr. Eiler reviewed the LSC Educational Vision as outlined on the attached PowerPoint slide. The LSC Vision, Mission Statement and Goal was completed.
4. Dr. Eiler reviewed the Task Force V overview per the attached PowerPoint.

CSO Schenkel Shultz will proceed in reliance on this report. Any discrepancies should be brought to our attention in writing within seven (7) days.

5. The meeting was opened to questions and comments and the following items were noted:
 - A. Russ Berkey inquired as to CSO Schenkel Shultz's role in the Pre-1028 process. Jim Schellinger noted that CSO Schenkel Shultz is an architectural and interior design firm that will be facilitating the Pre-1028 process. A brief review of CSO Schenkel Shultz's credentials was then completed.
 - B. Andrea Rademacher inquired as to whether there were existing standards for security measures. Dr. Eiler indicated that CSO Schenkel Shultz has provided a template for active and passive security systems within an elementary, middle and high school facility. These will also be checked against national standards for security measurements.
 - C. Russ Berkey inquired as to whether CSO Schenkel Shultz would proceed through all six workshops to which Jim Schellinger responded affirmatively.
 - D. A gentlemen present at the workshop at Jefferson High School indicated that he was involved with the Task Force work and strongly encourage members of the community to be present to tour the facilities to actual see the issues that are being dealt with Sunnyside.
 - E. Dr. Eiler reinforced that the Pre-1028 process is being coordinated by the school corporation in order to solicit additional input well above and beyond the input that was received from the 55 people who participated in the Task Force V study.
 - F. Steve Goffinet requested that CSO Schenkel Shultz address the Governor's statements about the elaborate construction of educational projects. Jim Schellinger noted that in his inaugural State-of-the-State Address, Governor Daniels indicated that he believed there was too much spending outside of the classroom and noted that his administration would emphasis "instruction in lieu of construction." Subsequent to that, the Department of Local Government Finance has put a magnifying glass on construction school spending and has developed benchmarks for renovation and new construction relative to elementary schools, middle schools and high schools. In addition, the Department of Local Government Finance has begun to take a closer look at facilities that support extra curricular activities, namely athletic facilities. Jim Schellinger gave a brief overview of projects that CSO Schenkel Shultz has been involved with noting that CSO Schenkel Shultz has successfully seen five projects approved by the DLGF, while noting that CSO Schenkel Shultz paid close attention to the DLGF cost guidelines.
6. CSO Schenkel Shultz once again requested all present to sign in and noted that the meeting notes from tonight's meeting as well as the PowerPoint slide presentation will be made available on the Lafayette School Corporation website. CSO Schenkel Shultz will email and/or contact those present to inform them as to when the notes and the PowerPoint will be posted.
